
What jobs do you need a white card course Melbourne?

The Construction Induction Course, otherwise known as the White Card Course Melbourne, is a course specifically targeted at those staff and contractors working on Construction sites in and around Melbourne and Victoria. It is a mandatory legal requirement for all persons involved in the construction industry.

The White Card course covers such areas as Occupational Health and Safety, OHS legislative requirements, Construction hazards and control measures, OHS communication and reporting processes and OHS incident response procedures. These topics will ensure that staff are more aware within their surrounds and not only able to take better care of themselves but also of their co-workers.

If you intend to work on a Construction site, whether it be as a site manager or supervisor, surveyor, labourer or trades person or if you are considered a person who will access operational construction zones unaccompanied by a current White Card holder or not directly supervised by an inducted person, then it is your responsibility to complete this training.

- Plumbers
- Electricians
- Builders
- Labourers
- Bricklayers
- Concreters
- Heavy Machinery Drivers
- Forklift Drivers
- Occupational Health and Safety Officers
- Foremen; and
- Supervisors; just to name a few, are all required to hold a current White Card for their purpose of their employment

In short, if you are a worker whose employment causes them to routinely enter operational construction zones then it is a requirement that for occupational health and safety reason you complete and maintain your White Card course qualifications. Whilst tradespeople may work predominantly in domestic or commercial settings, holding a current White Card course will make them more available across industry areas and allow for more flexibility in the jobs they take on.
